Post 712 held its regularly scheduled Meeting on the third Tuesday of the month, March 19, 2024, at 7 PM. The Meeting was held at the Brentwood VFW at 3801 Saw Mill Run Blvd, Pittsburgh, PA 15227.



First Vice Commander Lloyd Ray chaired the meeting and kept the positive momentum rolling. The Meeting lasted about 80 minutes and was followed by an enjoyable social period in the bar for pop and snacks or your drink of choice.

Chief Operating Officer (COO) Sherry Einhaus from Operation Troop Appreciation (OTA) attended the Meeting and accepted a donation of \$1,100 from Post 712 to OTA. Post 712 presented the check to Sherry and took a moment for a photo opportunity. Sherry thanked the Membership and explained the mission of OTA in supporting local Veterans and Active Duty Military. Sherry noted that OTA recently purchased and moved into a new location on Pennsylvania Ave in West Mifflin and OTA is working to bring the facility up to standards for a grand opening.

Mary Ann Marunich, President of the ALA, briefed the Membership on ALA activities. Mary Ann stated the recent planned trip to Southwestern Veterans Center was called off at the request of the Retirement Home Staff due to a virus that was active at the Center. The trip will be rescheduled. Typically the ALA provides donations of clothes and comfort items to the Veterans and sets up a snack bar and Bingo game or similar activity when they visit. Mary Ann invited Post Members to Volunteer to assist during the next visit, to which several Members pledged their support (I volunteered on one of these outings during 2023 and had a wonderful, and fulfilling experience). We'll let you know when the next trip is planned—I'll see you there!

The ALA will be selling Poppies at **Sam's Club in West Mifflin** on <u>May 24th and again on September 7th</u>, from 9 AM-3PM, and invited the Membership to participate with the ALA.

Welcome new Member Ann Guttendorf (U.S. Army). Ann was at the meet-

ing and had a chance to interact with some of the Membership. It's great to have you on-board. Hooah!

The intent is to keep the ticket price low, such as \$5, to encourage easy sales and to give the winner something that is really worth winning. A motion was made and passed and Lloyd is now researching the matter more thoroughly.

<u>Pleasant Hills Community Day 2024</u> will be Sunday, August 10, 2024 and will be held in Mowry Park as usual.—SAVE THE DATE—Post 712 will have a stand set up for Community Day and will be asking Members to take an hour or so to Volunteer with the Post Officers to staff the stand. More to follow as the date draws nearer.

Second Vice Commander John Dillon floated the idea of **selling Post 712 patriotic t-shirts** at events such as Community Day. The shirts are not only patriotic and comfortable to wear, they also have the benefit of advertising for Post 712 to help get the word out that just because we sold the building does not mean there is no longer a Post 712. There was interest among the Membership so John will do some research and report on his findings.

John and Adjutant Terry Choate are working on an idea for a, *Dinner with the Legion* event at **Texas Roadhouse** in West Mifflin/Pleasant Hills. This would be a similar event to the event held by the Riders during November 2023 in which the Legion advertises to raise awareness of the event and receives a percentage of sales from the event. Terry has point and is working the issue.

Post 712 has a **new Facebook Group**—"American Legion Post 712—The Virtual Post". We have added the phrase, "The Virtual Post" to our Group to highlight that we are not sitting around a building talking about old times and whiling away the days. Post 712 is a dynamic organization that is growing to support Veterans in need and our local community. KEVIN KORDZI M. ED EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

VETERANS PLACE OF WASHINGTON BOULEVARD

On March 8th, I had the pleasure of speaking with **Kevin Kordzi**, **M. Ed**, **the Executive Director of Veterans Place of Washington Boulevard** for his insight into supporting local Veterans in need. To begin with, Kevin very heartily thanked the Membership of American Legion Post 712 for our donation of \$1,200 during 2023 and our current donation of \$1,200 during 2024.

Before our discussion I reviewed the Mission Statement of Veterans Place which was found to be simply worded and to the point — *The Mission of Veterans Place is to empower veterans' transition from homelessness to home, ending the cycle of homelessness, and to assist all at-risk veterans to become engaged, valuable citizens who contribute to their communities.*

As to background, Kevin was previously a Board Member, though accepted the role of Executive Director during November 2023. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Human Development followed by a Master of Education degree in Counselor Education from Penn State University and has a tremendous breadth of experience he brings with him to Veterans Place. His previous roles include Case Manager and Clinical Supervisor for Southwestern Pennsylvania Human Services; Street Level Drug and Alcohol Counselor in New Kensington; and one of his first rolls was a Direct Care Provider at Mars Home for Youth also in Butler County

- When asked to tell us about Veterans Place (VP) Kevin noted three key operational venues in which VP helps Veterans in need.
- 1. Kevin stated there are about 750 Homeless Veterans in Allegheny County and a key first step is to **find and offer Vets access to services**. To do this VP drives to various homeless camps throughout the County and will pick up Homeless Veterans and transport them back to VP for a solid breakfast and lunch. VP works with these Vets to ensure they connect with the Veterans Administration and also provides training opportunities for skills such as resume writing.

- 2. For Homeless Vets who are committed to rejoining mainstream society, VP provides **Transit Housing** on-site in the form of a 52-bed unit complete with a partnership with the Allegheny Health Network (AHN) Street Medicine Team. The average stay for occupants is 7-8 months during which formerly Homeless Vets are getting healthy, improving life skills, and preparing to reenter the workforce. It is also a time when these Veterans can start saving money for rent once they leave VP.
- **3.** The third key area of aid is **Workforce Development**, during which Vets receive training and familiarization in skills to help them get and keep a job. Kevin noted the average hourly rate for Veterans in the program is \$17.85, which is a livable wage and enough for these Veterans to get back on their feet and keep moving forward.

During 2022 VP Fed 9,434 meals for Veterans and families and served over 800 Veterans all while preparing and placing 97 Veterans in sustainable employment. Further, 100% of Veterans in the Workforce Development program did attain sound employment.

When asked, what's next for VP? Kevin stated VP is in the process of expanding especially in transitional housing as when asked, Veterans report one of the greatest aspects of VP is they feel safe there. Currently VP has plans to build a 3-story building on-site to increase transitional housing. Kevin also noted a need to support female Veterans with children as many of these Veterans fall through societal cracks though they are frequently the persons with the greatest need.



To close out the discussion, Kevin was asked what message he wanted to leave with the Post 712 Membership, to which he again thanked the Membership for their recurring donations and noted the most

important message is for the Membership to become familiar with the great work of Veterans Place and their mission to aid Veterans. In doing this, getting the word out, the potential to positively impact Veterans increases exponentially. Kevin also invited the Post 712 Membership to visit Veterans Place to tour the facilities and see up close for themselves the great work being done to help Vets in need – to which your Officers of Post 712 will explore putting a trip together for the Membership.

POST 712 DONATES \$2,000 TO BRENTWOOD VFW POST 1810

Post 712 donated \$2,000 to VFW Post 1810 through a Membership vote, as part of VFW's Spring initiative. Both organizations got together at the VFW meeting on March 12th, 2024, during which the presentation was conducted. Most people do not realize **VFW 1810 hosts several organizations** within the building and is an anchor in the local Veterans Community. In fact, <u>many members of Post 712 are dual members of VFW Post 1810</u>.

Representing the Legion were **dual members** John Dillon, Nick Krawec, Dave Masslon, Thad Weidman, and Terry Choate, of which Thad and Terry made the presentation to VFW Post Commander Chuck Beattie. The donation was a way for the Legion to show their appreciation for the courtesy and camaraderie received from VFW 1810 and will be used for interior renovations.






COBRA ATTACK HELICOPTER
